

How to Get to Cook Street Village

Cook Street Village is a bustling little neighbourhood located at the south end of Cook Street. Full of wonderful shops, services and restaurants; it's THE place to spend a leisurely afternoon with a hot cup of coffee and a good book in a beautiful setting. It's also just a short stroll to Beacon Hill Park and the ocean.

Option 1: City Bus

Fare: \$2.50 (one zone fare)

A number of busses will take you to the heart of the Village:

#3 Gonzales - Travel Time: ~10 min.

Departs: Douglas Street near View (in front of Chapters Bookstore). Mon. - Fri. 2x an hour from 6:38am-7:40pm; Sat. 1-2x an hour from 7:04am-6:22pm; Sun. 1-2x an hour from 7:24am-5:48pm.

#2N Gonzales (Night Route) - Travel Time: ~10 min.

Departs: Douglas Street at Pandora (in front of City Hall) Mon. - Fri. about every 40 minutes from 8:15pm-11:40pm; Sat. about every 40 minutes from 7pm - 11:40pm; Sun. about every 50 minutes from 6:30-10:15pm

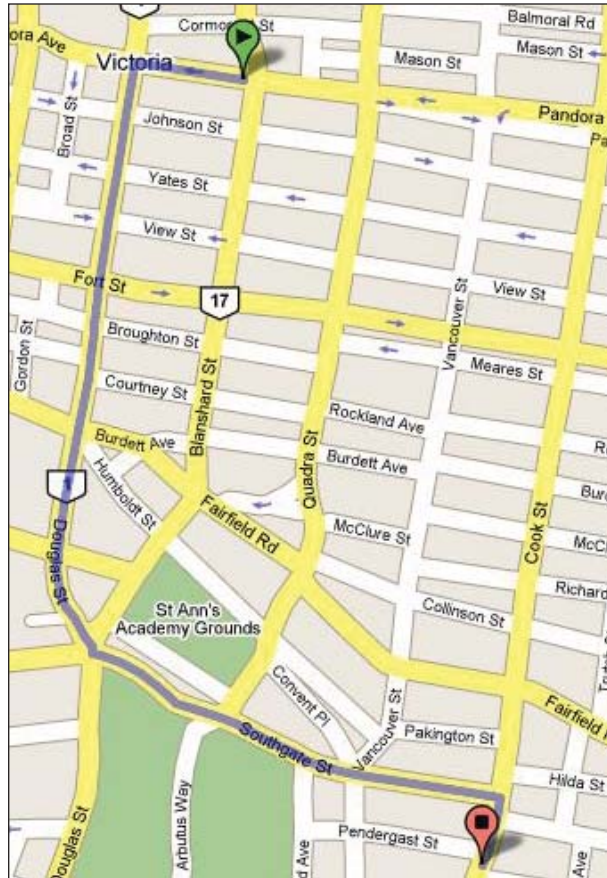
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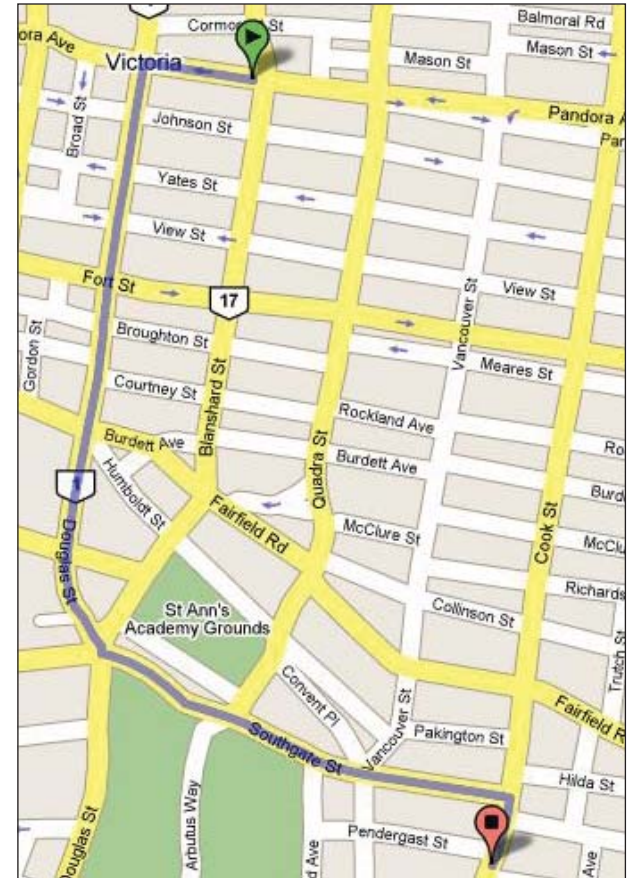
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
